**Olympic Peninsula Visitor Bureau and Grays Harbor Tourism
Join to Produce Long-Anticipated Olympic Peninsula Waterfall Trail Project**

Port Angeles, Wash. Olympic Peninsula Visitor Bureau (OPVB) and Grays Harbor Tourism (GHT) announce their joint cooperation to produce the Olympic Peninsula Waterfall Trail project. It will include a four-color brochure outlining 23 falls around the Peninsula in Clallam, Grays Harbor, Jefferson and Mason Counties. An interactive website devoted to Peninsula waterfalls, a Waterfall journal and the Waterfall WanderBlog where visitors can post their experiences and photographs of the local waterfalls is part of the project.

“The Waterfall Trail will attract many visitors during all seasons of the year,” said Diane Schostak, OPVB Executive Director. “Waterfalls are great viewing during times with lots of water, and we have three seasons with lots of water.”

Barbara Smith, Director of Tourism for GHT added another aspect of the project that will appeal to a wide range of visitors, “There really is something for everyone. Some falls are best viewed by boat, some by backpack, some after a short hike, one is wheelchair accessible. Some falls require route finding skills and some are bunched into one area, such as Lake Quinault and Enchanted Valley areas. Visitors and locals alike can find at least one falls that suits their explorer side.”

Expected debut for the entire Waterfall Trail project is fall 2008.
